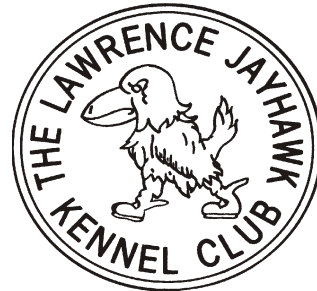

Dear LJKC members,
I'm writing you to let you know that an opportunity has come up for us to move back to California and we are going to take it. My mom has asked us to move back to California to be caretakers of the house and property she inherited when grandma passed away almost 4 years ago. Mom lives 4 hours away and has been trying to take care of the house herself by visiting every 3–5 months. Last year was just too much for her and she has realized that she can't continue to take care of 2 houses *and* take care of my stepdad who had a stroke about 3 years ago. We will be leaving for California April 19. This will allow me to finish helping Carolyn with the 7:30 Basic CGC class, run the NADAC agility trial in March with Riley and Dakota one last time and say goodbye to everyone.
We will be moving to a subdivision called Lake California which is 3 miles from the town of Cottonwood in Northern California. We are between Red Bluff, 16 miles to the south and Redding, 16 miles to the north and about 165 miles south of the Oregon border. We will be able to see Mt. I have already found the Shasta Kennel Club (AKC all breed club) and Rx:Pets is the Delta affiliate in the Redding area so I won't be out of the dog world too long. I have put in an application to attend Shasta County Community College in the fall. I have narrowed my choices down to Health Information, Paralegal or Criminal Justice. So I think my new best friends will be with the folks in the academic counseling office.

And I will also be contacting temp agencies to see about getting some work. This is going to be exciting adventure moving cross country with 4 dogs, I think, I'm not sure. I get the car with the dogs while David gets to drive the U-Haul. I'm not sure which one of us has the better deal. This will also be sad because I will be leaving a *wonderful* group of people but happy because we will be closer to family. Mom has already told me that she has planned some mother/daughter daytrips for us. I'm looking forward to doing that stuff with her. We are also looking forward to seeing my dad and stepmom and my brother and his wife more frequently. I will miss you all, thank you very much.
